4-H CAMP CHERRY LAKE

This year the Annual Summer Camp has been set for **June 25th thru June 29th**. The camp theme is **'Medieval'**.

2018 LLOYD RHODEN AGRICULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP

One-\$1,000.00 scholarship is presented annually to students majoring in agriculture at a Florida Institute of higher learning. This scholarship can be continued up to four (4) years in duration for each high school senior receiving the initial annual award.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible for the scholarship, a nominee must be a graduating high school senior from a county that annually places a county agricultural exhibit in the North Florida Fair, who:

- Has indicated through 4-H, FFA, or related activities a sincere interest and potential ability in the fields of agriculture.
- 2. Plans to enter an institution of higher learning in the State of Florida to study some phase of agriculture.
- 3. Has achieved an acceptable senior placement test score and acceptable grade point average in high school and maintains acceptable academic standing at the institution(s) attended to continue receiving the stipend. The recipient must maintain continuous enrollment with not more than one semester or summer off between two consecutive terms.

Nomination for the scholarships must be made by the 4-H Coordinator or a Vocational Agriculture Instructor and submitted to the Selection Committee appointed by the President of the North Florida Fair Association.

Nomination must be made by March 15th.

Nominated students will be mailed an application, which must be returned with all required paperwork to the Scholarship Committee **postmarked no later than May 1st**. Recipients will be selected July 1st of each year. The scholarships will be available at the beginning of the fall semester and be paid to the winner after registration at the selected institution and upon request of the President of the Association.
