**DATE:** June 13, 2019

On July 28, 2017, due to continuing delinquent ad valorem taxes, the Jefferson County Board of County Commissioners acquired title to the property located at 1240 Jefferson Street N. located in the City of Monticello. For approximately three decades the property was the site of Thompson Gas and on three occasions there were discharges of petroleum product on the property that were reported to the State. By letter dated May 22, 2019, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) notified the Jefferson County Board of County Commissioners, as the current owner, that the parcel is eligible for state petroleum remediation assistance funding and requested that the County enter into a Site Access Agreement for the property. See attachments "A" - Letter of May 22, 2019, and "B" - proposed Site Access Agreement. The Site Access Agreement will allow the State personnel and remediation contractors to enter on to the property for purposes of accomplishing contamination remediation activities. The letter further advises that failure to provide site access within thirty (30) days may result in loss of remediation funding eligibility.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> By operation of FS Section 197.502(8), three years after the day the property was offered for public sale, the property escheated to the county.

As stated in the letter, the site is eligible for up to \$400,000.00 funding under the State Petroleum Cleanup Participation Program (PCPP), with a site owner copay of 25%. There are options for potentially lowering the copay based on the County's ability to pay. Additionally, although the County does not have legal liability for contamination at the site under FS Section 197.502(8)(a), DEP takes the position that, in order to be eligible for PCPP funding, the County must still satisfy the 25% copay requirement. This issue has yet to be fully resolved.

On June 11, 2019, County Clerk Kirk Reams and I met with DEP staff to discuss the proposed Site Access Agreement and continued remediation activities at the site. It was learned that contamination remediation activity has been under way at this site for a number of years using a multiphase extraction system. As shown by DEP water quality sampling, concentrations of contaminants in most of the sampling wells have improved to the point of compliance with applicable water quality standards. However, the latest round of sampling in July of 2018 indicates four locations where pollutant concentrations are still above applicable thresholds. To address these locations, DEP staff has ordered, and is paying for, preparation of an updated Remedial Action Plan (RAP), which is due to be completed on July 2, 2019. The updated RAP will, in all likelihood, recommend chemical injection as an additional remediation measure.

At this time, as a first stage of completing remediation at the site, <u>it is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the Site Access Agreement</u>. See, Attachment "B." As the second stage, once completed, the updated RAP will be forwarded to the County for review. The updated RAP will provide all involved with a much better estimate of the costs for completing remediation. At that time staff for DEP and the County will meet again to discuss options and, following that meeting, the matter will be brought back to the Board of County Commissioners for further consideration.

# Petroleum Restoration Program SITE ACCESS AGREEMENT

- 1. <u>The Parties</u>. The undersigned real property owner, Jefferson County Board of County Commissioners, whose address is I Courthouse Circle Monticello, FL 32344 ("**Owner**"), hereby give(s) permission to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection, whose address is 2600 Blair Stone Road, MS# 4545, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-2400 ("FDEP" or "**Department**"), and the contractor, subcontractors, and vendors ("**Contractor**"), to enter the Owner's property located at 1240 Jefferson Street N. Monticello, FL 32344 with FDEP Facility ID# 338509757.
- 2. <u>The Property</u>. Owner owns that certain real property identified as folio number 00-00-0350-0000-0032, and located at 1240 Jefferson Street N., Monticello, Jefferson County, Florida, 32344 (the "**Property**"), as more particularly described in the legal description within Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 3. <u>Permissible Activities</u>. This Site Access Agreement ("**Agreement**") is limited to activities which may be performed by the Department or the Contractors pursuant to Chapter 62-780, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), without cost to the Owner (unless required in a separate agreement or is statutorily required for FPLRIP or ATRP programs) to locate contamination, determine contamination levels and, when necessary, remove and remediate contamination which may be performed by the Department and its Contractor. If the contamination is eligible for state funding, nothing herein is intended to modify the requirements and limitations of the eligibility program or order. The following activities are included in this Agreement but are not limited to this list:
  - conduct soil, surface, subsurface, and groundwater investigations, including but not limited to entry by a drill rig vehicle, and support vehicles:
  - install and remove groundwater monitoring wells;
  - use geophysical equipment;
  - use an auger for collecting soil and sediment samples;
  - locate existing wells;
  - collect waste, soil, and water samples;
  - remove, treat and/or dispose of contaminated soils and water;
  - remove contaminated soil by digging with backhoes, large diameter augers and similar equipment;
  - install, operate, and remove remedial equipment;
  - install and remove utility connections;
  - trenching for connection of remediation wells to equipment; and
  - conduct surveys, prepare site sketches, and take photographs.
- 4. <u>Duration and Termination of Access</u>. This Agreement is granted, without any fee or charge

to the Department or Contractor, for so long as is necessary to assess, remove, monitor and remediate the contamination on the Property. Access shall be allowed for the Department (including its employees and Department contracted site managers with Teams 5 and 6 or local government, if applicable) immediately upon the execution of this Agreement.

- 5. <u>County Coordinator</u>. The County Coordinator is authorized to exercise the Owner's rights and obligations under this Agreement, including, but not limited to, giving written consent to the Department's requests when necessary, approving any amendment or waiver of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and terminating the Agreement.
- 6. <u>Work Performed during Business Hours.</u> The Department and Contractor may enter the Property during normal Business Hours and may also make arrangements to enter the Property at other times with the Owner's prior written consent. "Business Hours" is defined as 7 A.M. to 7 P.M. (Eastern Time) during the weekdays.
- 7. Activities Comply with Applicable Laws. The Department and Contractor agree that any and all work performed on the Property and in association with this Agreement shall be done in a good, safe, workmanlike manner, and in accordance with applicable federal and state laws, and, if applicable, local laws.
- 8. <u>Proper Disposal of Contaminated Media</u>. The Department and Contractor shall ensure that soil cuttings, any work materials, and water generated shall be disposed of in accordance with Environmental Laws. All soil cuttings, waste materials and development water generated shall be promptly removed from the Property.
- 9. <u>Property Restoration</u>. The Department shall pay the reasonable costs of restoring the Property as nearly as practicable to the conditions which existed before activities associated with contamination assessment or remedial action were taken.
- 10. Owner's Non-Interference. The Owner shall not interfere with the Department or Contractor when performing the Permissible Activities. Owner shall not damage any equipment including wells, piping, and remediation system that may be located on the Property. Owner shall notify the Department at least thirty (30) days prior to commencement of any construction, demolition or other work on the Property that may damage or destroy any part of the equipment installed under this Agreement. If the Department anticipates that the remediation equipment will not be used for over one (1) calendar year, the Owner can request removal of the remediation equipment if it is interfering with the operation of the business or with planned construction activities.
- 11. Non-revocable. If Property is the source of the discharge that is eligible for State funded remediation pursuant to Chapter 376, Florida Statutes, access to the Property is required and Owner may not revoke this Agreement with the Department until the appropriate site rehabilitation completion order is issued pursuant to Section 376.3071, Florida Statutes, is final.
- 12. No Admission. The granting of this Agreement by the Owner is not intended, nor should it

be construed, as an admission of liability on the part of the Owner for any contamination discovered on the Property.

- 13. Owner's Use of Property. The Owner retains the right to use the Property, and the Department and its Contractors will work with the Owner regarding minimizing activities that may interfere with the Owner's management and use of the Property. However, neither the Department nor the Contractor are responsible for any inconvenience, economic injury, or business damage that Owner may suffer due to the performance of any Permissible Activity.
- 14. Owner's Release of Claim. If Owner selected a qualified contractor (not an agency term contractor), the Owner hereby releases the Department from any and all claims against the Department performed by the Owner's selected contractor arising from or by virtue of, the Permissible Activities.
- 15. <u>Injury to Department</u>. The Owner shall not be liable for any injury, damage or loss on the Property suffered by the Department, or Department's employees or Contractors, provided that it was not caused by the negligence or intentional acts of the Owner's agents or employees.
- 16. <u>Sovereign Immunity</u>. To the extent permitted by law, and without either party waiving its sovereign immunity or waiving any limits established by Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, the Owner and the Department acknowledges and accepts their responsibility and liability for torts under applicable law (Section 768.28, Florida Statutes) for damages caused by the acts of their respective employees while on the Property.
- 17. <u>Insured Contractors</u>. The Department shall require its Contractors, while performing services on the Property, to maintain commercial general liability insurance, automobile liability insurance, and workers' compensation insurance as required by Section 376.3071(6), F.S., and approved by the Department.
- 18. <u>Public Records</u>. All documents created or received associated with the Permissible activities are a public record pursuant to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Owner may retrieve any documents or other information related to the Permissible Activities online using the facility number reference above. <a href="https://depedms.dep.state.fl.us/Oculus/servlet/login">https://depedms.dep.state.fl.us/Oculus/servlet/login</a>
- 19. Entire Agreement. This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the Department and the Owner regarding this grant of access to Property by the Department and its Contractors as stated herein. No modification, amendment or waiver of the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be binding upon Department unless approved in writing by an authorized representative of the Owner and the Department.
- 20. <u>Governing Law and Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida. Venue for any action or proceeding arising

from or relating to this Agreement shall be in the appropriate Florida court having jurisdiction located in Jefferson County, Florida.

- 21. <u>Severability</u>. In the event that any part of this Agreement is found to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, that part shall be severed from this Agreement, and the balance of this Agreement shall remain in full force.

<u>Purpose.</u> The purpose of this program is to provide Jefferson County Board of County Commission support for activities and initiatives with non profit organizations and enhance the quality of life services within our community.
